

## How to Make Lisa's Orange Sequined Dress

#### What You Need:

- a sleeveless dress pattern with pre-cut paper pieces
- a roll of glamorous, silky orange fabric with a 1970s vibe
- thousands of round, orange sequins that twinkle effortlessly
- 1 reel of strong, bright orange cotton thread
- 1 gold zip
- sharp dressmaking shears

### **Instructions:**

- 1. Unroll sufficient fabric for each piece of the pattern's pre-cut paper to be arranged on top of it.
- 2. Carefully, use the shears to cut around each piece to create individual sections of fabric.
- 3. Follow the pattern to stitch each section together using the thread, leaving a gap at the back as long as the zip.

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- 4. Insert and sew the zip into the dress.
- 5. Painstakingly, attach the sequins one at a time until the dress is fully covered.
